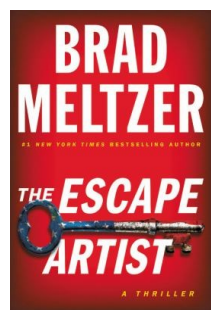
## [The Flight Attendant](#) by Christopher Bohjalian

## [Let Me Lie](#) by Clare Mackintosh

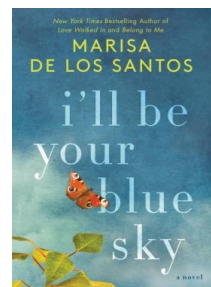

## [The Escape Artist](#) by Brad Meltzer

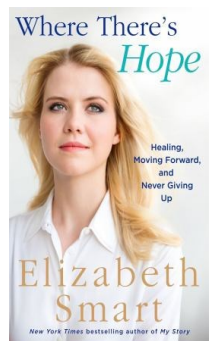

## [I'll Be Your Blue Sky](#) by Marisa de los Santos

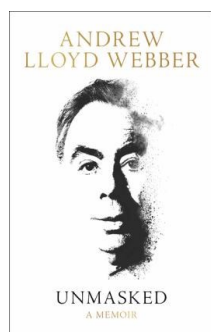
