


[Love and Ruin](#) by Paula McLain


[How It Happened](#) by Michael Koryta


[The Death of Mrs. Westaway](#) by Ruth Ware

The Perfect Mother by Aimee Molloy



The Crooked Staircase by Dean R. Koontz


