Marina Scott

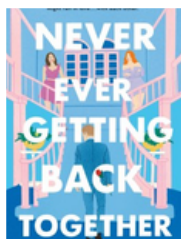

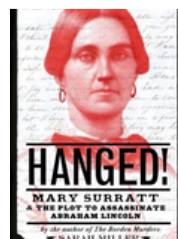


The Do-Over
