What a year it has been! When we rang in the New Year on January 1, little did we know what was in store for us in 2020. We closed the building to the staff and public on Sunday, March 15 and opened for curbside service on May 18. On June 1, we opened the public computer room for use by appointment only. On August 3, the 140th day from the shutdown, with joy, the Library opened its doors to the public for 30-minute browsing. Along the way, we have offered new services, and many virtual programs for patrons of all ages via

Facebook, Livestream, YouTube, and Zoom. We have championed conversations with community members and staff on race, ethnicity, and inclusion, and we have witnessed a polarizing presidential election. Like all of us, the Library encountered many challenges this past year, but I'm so incredibly proud of the new and innovative ways we have been able to safely serve our patrons and community.

We also unveiled the Library's 2020 Strategic Plan, which will help guide the Library through the next several years. This plan will align with our new vision and mission statements, tag line, and organizational priorities. We are excited about the direction we are headed and look forward to a new year full of new opportunities. We have received many positive comments and are thrilled with the clean and engaging design.
