



A Message From the Director



After an unprecedented year of challenges and uncertainty I am looking forward to the upcoming summer season with a renewed sense of excitement and optimism. While the news is encouraging, we will continue to serve the patrons of the Library in the safest manner possible by following the directives of the Governor. This includes recommendations on reducing quarantine on returned materials before they are checked-in and gatherings of more than 10 people.

When Cuyahoga County reaches Level II on the Ohio Health Advisory System we plan to:

- Increase capacity from 30 to 55 patrons inside the building,
- Add limited seating throughout the Library,
- Open 15-minute computers throughout the building, and
- Make more computers available in the Public Computer Room.

We have been hard at work implementing activities that align with our Strategic Plan. One of the highlights that will bring immediate impact to all of you is our plan to remain open on Sundays this summer! We are working to make a few key hires to staff these additional Sunday hours.

Stay tuned for information regarding reserving public meetings for local and non-profit groups later in the summer. The Foundation of Rocky River Public Library donated nearly \$85,000 in the last year to help update the technology in our meeting rooms including new screens, new digital projectors, pan-tilt-zoom cameras for livestream, and an upgraded sound system that includes assistive listening devices for those with hearing impairment. That donation also includes an update to the digital sign on the corner of Hampton and Riverview. Our new logo and tagline will be featured, and the 14-year-old digital display replaced.

As you well know, COVID-related news changes quickly, so I urge you to check the Library website, or sign up for our monthly email newsletter to receive Library highlights directly in your inbox, for updates throughout the summer months.

COWAN POTTERY MUSEUM ASSOCIATES offer support to the Museum and its activities, in addition to itself promoting the importance of Cowan Pottery in its historical and artistic contexts. These donations further illustrate the evolution of the Cowan Pottery Studio as it has created and re-worked designs over the years, while also showing examples of the studio's unique output.

The items in these donations represent some of the earlier or unique pieces produced by the studio. The two early Cowan Bookends are an example of the studio's output while in Lakewood (1912-1917) and show examples of early glaze production. Though seen as a wall pocket in the past, the form for the figural lamp was not ever listed as an option for a lamp and may be unique.


THE WOMEN'S COMMITTEE OF ROCKY RIVER PUBLIC
