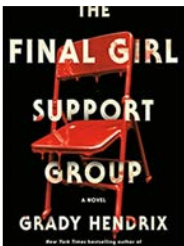
The Women's March **Jennifer Chiaverini**

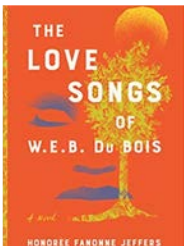
The Forest of Vanishing Stars **Kristin Harmel**

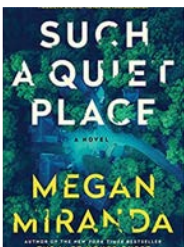
The Final Girl Support Group **Grady Hendrix**

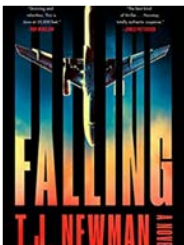
The Love Songs of W.E.B. Du Bois **Honoree Fanonne Jeffers**

Such A Quiet Place **Megan Miranda**

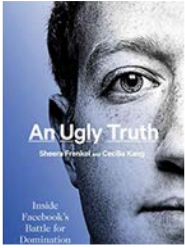
