

In 1860, long after the US outlawed the importation of enslaved laborers, 110 men, women and children from Benin and Nigeria were kidnapped and brought to Mobile, Alabama. Despite being secretly parceled out to various plantations, they attempted to maintain both their culture and also fit into their place of captivity. After the Civil War, the survivors created a community for themselves they called African Town, which still exists to this day. This powerfully affecting historical novel-inverse recreates a pivotal moment in US and world history, the impacts of which we still feel today.


ANATOMY: A LOVE STORY


CITY OF VILLAINS
