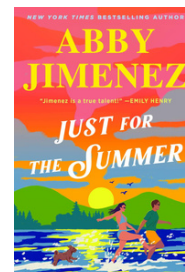
### *Close to Death* **Anthony Horowitz**

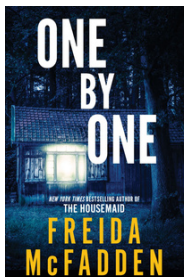
### *The Familiar* **Leigh Bardugo**

### *Just for the Summer* **Abby Jimenez**

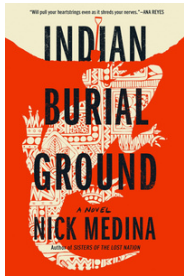
