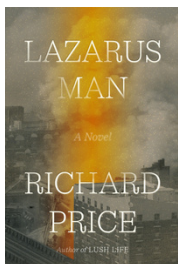
The Lies We Leave Behind **Noelle Salazar**

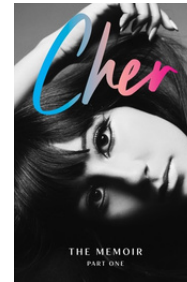

Lazarus Man **Richard Price**

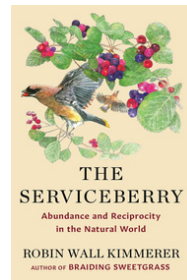

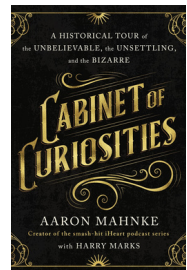
