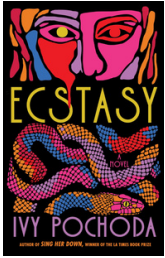
Park Avenue **Renee Ahdieh**

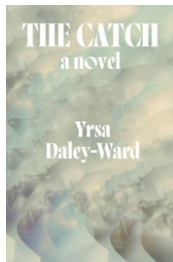

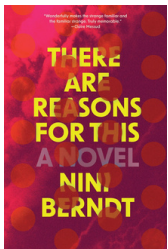

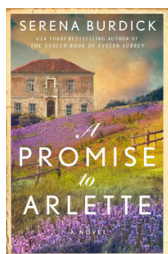
The Catch

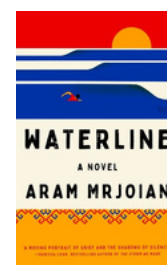
